SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

FORMAT:

- MS Word document (doc/docx) by electronic submission only (see below)
- Times New Roman font size 12
- Avoid double paragraph spacing
- Include: Preferred title and author, and place word count at end of document.

WORD COUNT:

- 800 words maximum (500 words is ideal)
- Longer articles may be considered at the discretion of the Editor. Please email in advance of publication deadline with short summary of article (see contact details below).

PHOTOGRAPHS:

- Maximum of four photographs only.
- Jpg file preferred if sending separately. Minimum resolution 300dpi.
- Alternatively, photographs may be embedded within the Word document.
- All photographs, must be accompanied by an explanatory caption and the photographer's credit (if not the author of the article).
- Important: When photographing a person or people permission must be obtained from the subject/s for the photograph to be published. While we do not require written permissions for photographs of adults, we shall assume that permission has been granted to the photographer, and we do not take any responsibility for any offence caused by the publication of the photograph. However, if the photograph depicts a child it must be accompanied by written and signed permission from a parent or guardian of said child (a child is deemed to be a person under 18 years of age). Any photograph deemed by the Editor to be of a sensitive or offensive nature will not be published.

- June issue first week May
- September issue first week August
- December issue first week November
