You may include a figure or image relating to your talk. This could be representation of your data, a field work happy snap, an image of the fossil/material you are discussing, or a photo of yourself or your team working on this project. Both the text and the figure must fit on this A4 page.

These submissions will be available as a pdf booklet at the symposium, but will not be printed, in order to save paper. The pdf booklet will be available online before the symposium if you wish to print your own copy.
